Preventing Suicide

Suicide, by definition, is fatal Suicide also affects the health of others and the community When people die by suicide, their family and friends often experience shock, anger, guilt, and depression The economic toll of suicide on society is immense as well Suicides and suicide attempts cost the nation approximately \$70

Aborted Suicide Attempts: A New Classification of Suicidal ...

attempt suicide eventually die by suicide (6-9), the risk of suicide among those with a history of suicide at-tempts is substantially elevated One study found that the risk of a subsequent suicide attempt increases by about 32% for each prior attempt (10), and, by extension, it is likely that the risk of suicide would increase as well

Suicide attempt survivors - individuals who have survived a prior suicide attempt Suicide survivors - family members, significant others, or acquaintances who have experienced the loss of a loved one due to suicide; sometimes this term is also used to mean suicide attempt survivors

Suicide Definition: Suicide deaths are those resulting from an intentional injury, poisoning, or suffocation in which there is evidence that a self-inflicted act led to the person's death Suicide deaths from 1999-2014 include records with ICD-10 codes of X60-X84 or Y870 Suicide deaths from prior years include all death records

Suicide is rarely a new and surprising idea to depressed individuals In most cases, it is a relief to have "permission" to talk about it A more dangerous

situation is where the individual feels that suicide is too "shameful" to mention which may result in increased feelings of isolation
